On the Großer Hirschgraben next to the Goethe House, three new houses are built. One of them houses the Romantik-Museum. From the main entrance in the first house, a staircase runs parallel to the façade and leads to the exhibition rooms on the second and third floor. To secure the art works the windows only light up the staircase. An emblem of the new museum is the “blue bay window” above the main entrance, in which the windows are made of blue-colored glass. Diagonally above the blue bay window, a dormer provides a view to the Paulskirche and the Kaiserdom. The entrance area with the cloakroom is on the ground floor. Paintings are exhibited on the first floor. The permanent exhibition about romanticism is on the second and third floor, while the basement offers space for changing exhibitions.
